Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Blossom and Willow Class visit to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm!

Last week, our children from Blossom and Willow Classes enjoyed a fantastic day out at Noah's Ark Zoo Farm! This helped our children in Blossom Class to extend the learning they have been doing this term about bug hunting and about the importance of bees, and during the trip the children took part in a workshop 'It's a Bug's Life' where they had the opportunity to hold cockroaches, stick insects and leaf insects. The Zoo staff were wowed by their super scientific vocabulary! Meanwhile, our children in Willow Class have been exploring animal diets, senses and habitats and took part in a workshop explaining how animals use their senses and compared that to how humans use their senses.



During their time at Noah's Ark Zoo Farm, the children were also very lucky to see a variety of wild animals including elephants, giraffes, zebras, lions, camels and a rhinoceros! Although the animals live in lovely large recreations of their natural environments, the children were able to get really close to them, whilst they also got to observe the behaviours of some pet and farm animals in another area of the Zoo! The children were brilliant representatives of Nerrols School and the adults accompanying them were really impressed with their listening, questions and enthusiasm! Birch Class visit to Cheddar Gorge!

Birch Class had an exciting trip to Cheddar Gorge recently, linking perfectly with their learning in History of the Cheddar Man. The children had the opportunity to explore Gough's Cave and Cox's Cave, where they were amazed by the towering rock formations and sparkling stalactites! In a hands-on Stone Age workshop, the children tried on traditional clothing and learned how early humans made tools. The highlight of the trip was almost definitely visiting the very site where the Cheddar Man was discovered—bringing their classroom learning to life in a truly unforgettable way!

Maple Class visit to Exmouth!

To support their learning in Geography about coasts this half term, the children in Maple Class have also been on an exciting school trip to Exmouth! The children were especially thrilled to go on a boat cruise, where they observed the coastline and eagerly looked out for sea creatures along the way. They also learned some fascinating facts from their guide, who explained the tides and pointed out areas of interest around Exmouth beach.

The children loved seeing the different lifeboats in action and finding out how the RNLI helps keep people safe at sea. They were particularly excited to explore the crew's uniform - and even try on a lifeboat helmet! It was another fantastic learning experience for the children, and one we are sure that they'll remember for a long time!

Curriculum Update: Reports and test papers

You should by now have received your child's end of year School report, which details their areas of success and achievement over the last academic year, and I hope you enjoy celebrating these together! Alongside your child's Report, you will also find a feedback slip which we encourage you to complete and return to us by the end of the school year to let us know your thoughts about your child's successes, achievements and progress this year. Your views are really important to us here at Nerrols and will helps us to continue improving; a big thank you to those of you who have already sent these back in!

Soon, your child will also be bringing home some test papers that they completed in class during the summer term and as part of our everyday approach to teaching and learning. The main aims of the children completing these tests are to help us better understand how well they have understood what they have been taught and to help us best plan future learning to help them keep making progress. In the subjects of English reading, Mathematics, and English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling, the children's scores from these test papers are converted in outcomes which you will find in their end of year Report. The children's outcomes in English writing are based on teacher assessments made from the work they have produced right across the curriculum and across the whole school year.





Curriculum Update - Reading: Boost mental wellbeing and stop the 'Summer Slide'

This Summer holiday we want to work with you to boost your child's mental wellbeing and avoid the 'Summer Slide' in their reading progress. We know that routines can go a little out the window during the school holidays but prioritising a short amount of time for your child to practise their reading and enjoy a book read by you (at whichever time of the day works for you) will really support their confidence when they move into their new class. We've therefore put together a few ideas to help this happen!

Children on the Phonics Scheme: We will be sending home new QR codes to watch our Phonics videos and many children will also have sound cards.

Children on book banded books: For the first time this year, we've given children the option of keeping their current reading book over the Summer. If your child opted out (and you'd rather they opted in!), please speak to your child's current class teacher.

All readers: Take part in the Somerset Libraries Summer Reading Challenge. **All children** can take part and we encourage your child can bring in their medal and certificate to show us in September! It's really simple to join, and free: <u>Summer Reading Challenge 2025</u>

The Kingfisher Project!

This half-term, the children in Maple Class have been taking part in an exciting local project called *The Kingfisher Project*. As part of this, the children visited a farm in Curry Rivel where they met local experts and learned all about farming and wildlife. Farmer Henry showed the children how wheat is turned into flour, and they also discovered the important role that trees play in providing habitats for animals! The children also learned about bees, moths, and butterflies too - and all thoroughly enjoyed spending time outdoors, surrounded by nature.

After the trip, the children worked incredibly hard to create a variety of responses inspired by what they had learned. Their fantastic work included sculptures, fact sheets, and even some delicious

scones! Many of our children and staff proudly attended the celebration event, where their creations were displayed and judged alongside entries from other local schools.

We're thrilled to share that Nerrols Primary School won the Year 3–4 category and were runners-up overall! As part of our prize, we received £100 to spend on outdoor resources for our school community. A huge well done to all the children in Maple Class for their creativity, enthusiasm, and teamwork!



Adriana wins Gold!

We are excited to be able to let everyone know that Adriana, who is in Hazel Class, recently represented the South West area as she competed in the Trampoline Tumbling and DMT Inter-regional Final Cup Competition 2025 in Birmingham. Adriana competed against gymnasts from across England as well as from Wales, Scotland and Norther Ireland and won gold in the DMT (Double Mimi Trampoline) and bronze on the Trampoline! Celebrating Children's Birthdays!

From the start of the next academic year, we're excited to introduce a new school tradition: we are inviting the children to come to school wearing non-school uniform on their birthday! We believe this small change will help make each child's special day feel even more memorable and joyful and is also a great opportunity for our staff to get to know our children even better as part of our relational approach. We also hope that this small gesture will help to foster a stronger sense of belonging and wellbeing as each child feels recognised and celebrated within our Nerrols community. If a child's birthday falls over a weekend, during a half-term or other break from school, we ask that they wear their non-school uniform on the closest day **before** their birthday so that we can wish them a happy birthday before their special day. Finally, this idea is invitational, and the children do not have to wear non-school uniform on, or near, their birthday if they do not want to.

Holiday Club

We are excited to announce that we will once again be running our **Nerrols Holiday Club** and are now taking bookings for the summer holidays! The Holiday Club will be running on the following dates throughout the summer:
