In a world where, arguably, too much focus is placed upon other more traditional academic subjects our work to redesign our Art and Design curriculum in order that every child receives dedicated weekly Art and Design lessons, the creation of an inspiring Art Studio, the launch of a KS2 Art Club and facilitating collaborations with local artists has brought a welcome creative opportunity for our children.

This is a wonderful milestone for our school and something we should all feel proud of. This recognition celebrates our strong commitment to creativity and the arts across our curriculum and school life, and we are already excited and looking forward to the journey ahead as we aim for Gold!

Throughout her time so far at Nerrols Nursery, and during the recruitment process, Lili has demonstrated great passion and knowledge for all things early years and began her new role at the start of November.
- ✓ Miss Olivia Tolman will soon be joining us as an Apprentice Learning Support Assistant and will be working with children and classes across our school. Some of our children will already know Miss Tolman following placements she has completed with us in our Nursery and Oak Class over the last couple of years, and we are delighted that she will now be completing her apprenticeship with us.

Staying Safe at Nerrols – Staying safe this Autumn and Winter

On Wednesday, the first day of the new half-term, I spoke to the children about the importance of keeping themselves safe this autumn and winter during our Whole School Assembly. There are many exciting events at this time of year, such as Halloween, Bonfire Night and everything that comes with Christmas, and many of which may involve fireworks. We reminded the children that:

- Fireworks must only be handled by adults!
- Children must always stand well back from firework and bonfire displays!
- You must never touch a firework, even if you think it has gone out!
- A sparkler is a special type of firework and can be great fun, but children should always wear gloves, hold them at arm's length, never run or get too close to others and only use sparklers outside!
- Animals often get scared around fireworks, so keep pets inside and make them comfortable!



As the nights draw in and it gets darker much earlier, we also reminded the children to always stay close to a trusted adult, wear brighter clothing and remember to stay safe around roads if they do need to be out late. Please do take the time to talk to your children about all the ways in which they can keep themselves safe at this time of year too!

Nerrols Holiday Club

During the recent half-term break, we were once again able to keep our children active and learning and support our community by running our **Nerrols Holiday Club!** A big thank you to those of you who booked their child a place and supported this provision, with the money that we make being reinvested into supporting our children even more!
