

The Story of our PE and Sport Premium Spend 2025-26

This year has been a successful one regarding moving our Physical Education, Physical Activity and School Sport Offer forward at Nerrols Primary School and Nursery. Below I will outline some of the ways we have used our PE and Sport Premium Funding to support these developments. At the end of my second year in the role of PE lead, I would like to share these.

Engagement with after school sports clubs

This year has seen a further increase in the number of participants in our after-school clubs. We have used PE and Sport Premium funding to:

- Buy equipment to introduce new sports and activities.
- Buy in extra adult support to enable more children to attend after school clubs.

This year we had had 315 spaces filled by children taking part in after school activities such as ultimate ball games club, hit, catch and run club, archery, gymnastics, cricket, football, athletics, fitness, multi skills, multi sports, rugby, dance and netball. A special thank you goes to Miss Rapsey for her work on promoting the clubs and Miss Haynes, Miss Simpson and Miss Baker for providing support, allowing more children to attend clubs.



Targeted activities aimed at children that don't currently attend after school clubs

This year we set up clubs specifically aimed at particular groups of children to encourage further activity through a mix of structured and free play activities, overseen by our Year 6 leaders. We used PESP money to fund the leadership programme for our Year 6 leaders and funded staff support for these sessions to be able to take place. This also allows for more activity to be planned and delivered by young people, for young people.



Improving the quality of lunchtime activity

We have been continuing our work around lunchtime provision and working on the quality of activity for the children. Alongside the introduction of structured activities run by me at lunchtime, we have also added play leads who section off an area of the 3G pitch and offer a wide range of activities for children to step in and try, such as dodgeball, golf, hockey and tagging games. We have used PESP funding to resource this.

School Competition organised by Somerset Activity and Sports Partnership



This year once again we have accessed the SASP Buy-In using PESP funding and this has allowed us to take part in both competitions and festivals in a range of activities.



Engagement with outside organisations

This year we have attended festivals organised by SASP for the first time held at a local secondary school. This has come as a part of the SASP Buy-In

We have also engaged with Somerset Cricket Foundation and accessed some specialist coaching through Chance To Shine. We have used funding to have membership with the Cricket Board, allowing us to attend the school's day at Somerset CCC, watching England v India women's teams.



Activities run by young people for young people

We have worked with our Year 5 class to develop leadership skills, and they have run some festivals for our younger children. We have used PESP funding to resource these. They also ran our Key Stage One Sports Day.



Further development of intra school competition

We have worked on incorporating the school games values into our intra school competition offer. We have used PESP funding to buy resources to run our intra school competition.



Top up swimming

We funded our top up swimming programme using PESP funding and this was separate to our curriculum swimming and enabled a higher number of children to achieve the required end of Key Stage 2 standard.

Working hard on our offer this year has enabled us to achieve the School Games Award Gold for this year. Well done to everyone!
